COCAT links the international and the national (local) levels of voluntary movement. Our work camps are realworld volunteering experiences at the local and global levels.

Every year, more than 500 young Catalans carry out volunteer projects abroad, and more than 150 young people from all over the world participate in the international work camps that are carried out in Catalonia and organized by Catalan youth associations.

All our work camps take place in small towns and villages of Catalonia. It is a good chance for volunteers to learn more about the country, to see its picturesque landscapes, and to experience its traditions.

Catalonia is in the northeast of the Iberian Peninsula. It has a territory of 32.114 km2 and close to 8 million inhabitants. The Catalan landscape is varied from Pyrenean mountains to coastal regions, all under beautiful Mediterranean tones.

Culturally, there are vibrant customs and celebrations that we are proud to exhibit. The historical invasions and political conquests gave Catalonia the awareness to open its doors to intercultural dialogue and to live old and new traditions of the Catalan community and values.


PARLES CATALÀ?

WORK CAMPS IN A NUTSHELL

In work camps, you and other people from all over the world collaborate with an entity for 15 days. They are non-formal learning experiences for young people coming from different places. Through the work camps, you support non-profit projects, develop the local community's traditions, and promote ideals of solidarity and inclusion. This year we propose 4 work camps for adults and 2 for teenagers (14-17 y.o) WITHOUT EXTRA FEE.

IMPORTANT TECHNICAL INFORMATION



- The group should bring a camp leader.
- The hosting organization will provide a technical camp leader (included in the accommodation price).
- There are several catering options as the group can self-organise for food, or, in some camps, there is food provided at a cost.
- Payment details after group confirmation: a single payment is due to COCAT, no later than 2 months before the project begins.
- Cancellation policy after payment: a fee from the total payment will be considered as a deposit and is non-refundable in case of cancellation.



BUILDING COMMUNITY IN LA RIBA

La Riba is a youth camp managed by the Fundació Escolta Josep Carol for the Generalitat de Catalunya, designed to allow various youth groups and educational entities to access nature. It is a natural space set up as a camping ground, open year-round for children and youth, with facilities including a kitchen, shelter, swimming pool, showers, and toilets. Over 1,000 people camp here annually and the wear and tear of some spaces is evident.





The technical work that will be carried out is:

Painting: La Riba area has three buildings: the kitchen, the porch, and the caretaker's house. Over time and due to weather conditions, the paint has worn off, and it is necessary to repaint these facilities. Additionally, in the shower and toilet area, a coat of paint will also be required in some external and internal zones.

Clearing: to help prevent forest fires in the nearby wooded area, participants will clear the underbrush in collaboration with forest rangers.





SANT ANTONI'S TOWER

The young volunteers will participate in the maintenance of the Sant Antoni's Tower space in the municipality of Jesús. This is a meeting place for young people from different international programs; Young people are not only accommodated in this space, but workshops, exchanges, and long-term stays have also been held since 2021. The tents are placed in the exterior areas of Sant Antoni which will be conditioned so that they can be used for different purposes: an ecological garden to employ young people, leisure areas, ornamental plant areas, etc.

With this project, the young participants assist with the maintenance of the tower: repainting doors, building stone walls, painting fences, and making stone constructions, as well as getting to know the local community where the project is developed in collaboration with other local partners.

Volunteers will conduct many tasks, such as: the identification and selection of plants, the construction of walls, the repainting of different structures in the area, and the identification and cleaning of watering cans.







EBREFOLK FESTIVAL





The EBREFOLK project promotes the ethnomusical heritage of the coastal regions of the Ebre River and its tributaries—a shared area between Aragón, Catalonia, and the Valencian Community. Over the course of four days in July, Móra d'Ebre hosts a variety of workshops, celebrations, musical performances, and exhibitions.

The project focuses on workshops taught by a specialist from the field, designed for anyone interested in deepening their understanding of the traditional musical culture of this region. The main focus of the project is to provide a fresh perspective on the ethnomusical and ethnocoreological heritage of these territories The volunteers participate in the events of the Ebrefolk festival and are involved in daily activities such as cleaning up the town and they will become part of the community's life.

The tasks will be related to the promotion of the festival, organizing and preparing all the logistics and assembly of the stage, monitoring the entry of the public, preparing and setting up the festival space, conducting and participating in the workshops, food preparation, and cleaning and recycling.









ANCIENT TRAILS MUSEUM



The purpose of this work camp is to participate in the recovery of old paths and to learn about the history of the Pyrenees, its culture and nature, and to participate in different activities of preservation and conservation.

The technical work of the projects involves the conservation of old paths in the Valley of Siarb and consists of physical tasks.








The following are the main tasks:

- Road clearing: mowing grass, bushes that grow in the spring to keep the roads comfortably passable on foot.
- Remove stones from the road: pick up stones that have fallen onto the road and place them neatly at the edges to ensure safe passage.
- Rebuild the simplest sections of dry stone walls: repair those walls that have fallen and are easily reconstructible.
- Improve signage with paint: review the tracking marks of the paths with paint according to the instructions provided by the Alt Pirineu Natural Park.
- Reconstruction of dry stone walls.
