The European Solidarity Corps brings together young people to build a more inclusive society, supporting vulnerable people and responding to societal challenges. It offers an inspiring and empowering experience for young people who want to help, learn and develop.

Principles of the European Solidarity Corps

European Solidarity Corps participants carry with them ideas, convictions and expectations. The participating organisations have to be mindful of these needs as they are responsible for providing a respectful and trusting hosting environment. At the same time, the organisations participating in the initiative devote a great deal of time, energy and resources to set up a high-quality activity; they should therefore expect that European Solidarity Corps participants show a similar level of respect for the local communities and the people that are directly concerned by the activities.

These general principles of conduct take into account the great variety of potential participants, organisations and environments in which activities may be performed. They should be adapted to the specific circumstances of each activity.

- joining the European Solidarity Corps must always be the voluntary choice of a young person, and they are free to resign from the initiative. They have the right to refuse to accept any offer of a Corps placement without affecting their chance to receive other offers in the future;
- the participation in the European Solidarity Corps does not involve the payment of any fee;
- at the end of their placement, European Solidarity Corps participants are entitled to receive a European Solidarity Corps certificate, confirming their participation in the activity;
- when accepting a placement for a volunteering activity, European Solidarity Corps participants
 will sign a Solidarity Contract with the participating organisation, detailing the conditions of their
 activity, in line with the principles of the European Solidarity Corps Charter. For an occupational
 activity, the employment contract will serve a similar purpose;
- prior to the start of the activity and during their deployment, European Solidarity Corps participants will receive clear information about the tasks they will carry out and, where appropriate, adequate training and linguistic support.

ABOUT PROJECT

In late 2019, the pandemic process that started in Wuhan, China and spread all over the world, causing a long-term and multifaceted chaos, deeply affected the social, cultural, sport and economic lives of countries, especially health. The measures taken by countries and the restrictions made within this scope have concerned young people as well as every age group. It has caused young people, who have a critical importance in the future and development of society, to move away from socialization channels (education, sport, social activities, friendship relations, professional experiences, etc.). In this context, the pandemic process had a great impact on the physical and mental health of young people.

Our project will enable young people in disadvantaged conditions to realize their own strengths through sports, not to limit their thoughts and not to lose their belief in change. Sport will empower young people to transform their lives in the face of existing unfavorable living conditions.



ABOUT VOLUNTEERING

Within the scope of the project, the volunteer will take part in various activities on sports, healthy life, art and environment and the volunteer will organise various activities on his/her own competencies and skills. The volunteer will also volunteer in the office. Volunteers will both contribute to their personal development and contribute to the local community and the development of young people. They will involve them in activities with their own interests and abilities, raise awareness and engage in various activities. Volunteers will also use their organisational and creative skills to support the preparation and organisation of international events for young people organised by the association.



ACCOMMODATION, FOOD AND TRANSPORT ARRANGEMENTS

In Sorgun you will share an apartment with double rooms, bathrooms and an eat-in kitchen. Accommodation s provided by the coordinating organization SORGED. You will live in the apartment together with other ESC volunteers. Volunteers will have kitchen utensils and internet in ther home. In accordance with the rules of the Türkiye National Agency, 6 euro per day will be pad for pocket money for volunteers.



TRAINING DURING THE ACTIVITY

The main activities to be carried out by volunteers are as follows:

- -SORGED administrative and office work;
- -Organisation of sports, healthy living, environmental and cultural activities;
- -Outdoor activities (sports and environmental activities involving local people)
- -Trainings to support the personal development of volunteers (such as teamwork, leadership)
- Participate in Turkish lessons;
- Organise activities with young people locally;
- prepare and present presentations on Erasmus+ and ESC;
- -Organise intercultural activities;
- English speaking clubs



TIMETABLE

Volunteers will work from Monday to Friday with one hour lunch break, for maximum 35 working hours per week.

Availability to work during Saturday and Sunday in case of aktivites and events. Volunteers will work for 5 days per week, with 2 consecutive days off (normally Saturday and Sunday). In Summer, due to school holidays the timetable can change a little. Volunteers will get 2 days of holiday per month.

To be interested in the project topic, to be motivated to do sports, to be sensitive to the environment and to work on issues, to be interested in different cultures, to be creative, active, open-minded and open to teamwork, to be able to work as a volunteer and to be ready to take responsibility, to be open to education and innovations, to be able to represent the home country and the sending organisation in the best way, to be able to speak English at least to express themselves, to be solution-oriented and tolerant, to work in a planned manner and to accept all the rules of Erasmus+ and ESC programmes and to be between the ages of 18-30.

WHERE AND WHEN?

The project will take place in Sorgun district of Yozgat. Total population of Sorghum 80 thousand. Yozgat, also known as Bozok Plateau and has been inhabited since ancient times, is a city known for its unspoilt nature, hospitable warm people, natural beauties, promenade places, high plains, historical, cultural, touristic values and hot springs. Çamlık National Park is Turkey's first national park is located here. Bozok University established in 2006 and 23 thousand young people between the ages of 18-23 come to Yozgat to study. Yozgat is located in the middle of Turkey and Sorgun is the largest and most developed district of Yozgat. It has been home to many civilizations throughout its history. It is rich in hot water springs and there are many "Turkish Baths" in the city.





WHERE AND WHEN?


