## About ijgd

ijgd is a non-profit, non-denominational organization which has been active in international youth work since 1949. Each year ijgd organizes international youth workcamps in Germany. In cooperation with partner organizations of the Alliance a worldwide network has been created, so that volunteers can participate in workcamps all over the world. However, this program will focus on workcamps in Germany. Our aim is to encourage young people to become aware of existing social and environmental conditions, enabling them to become an active and responsible participant in a democratic society. This learning process leads (among other things) to the examination of one's own cultural norms and values. Consequently, it will help break down barriers between people which have been built on cultural, social and ethnical differences. This development of international understanding is regarded as a contribution to the furtherance of world peace.

**ijgd** is a registered charity and does not have a political, religious or institutional affiliation. ijgd receives funds from the European Union and from the German Ministry for Youth.













## ijgd Workcamp Conditions

- **Age limit:** Participants are usually between 16 to 26 years (except Teenage-Camps 14-17 years and camps that are explicitly only from 18-26). ESC Projects are open from 18-30. We can't do any exceptions regarding the mentioned age. We don't have any teenage camp from 14 year old!!
  - **Minors** (under 18 years) need written permission (which they must bring to the camp!) from their guardians. PA will be attached to the infosheet
  - BUT: we decided to charge the regular teenage fee to 150€ for volunteers under 18 who apply for our mixed-aged camps. We had to decide this, as our Camps became younger and younger and 18+ volunteers applied less. But also, for our leaders it became more and more a challenge with more than 50% Teenagers in every camp!
- **Camp language:** English is the camp language in most ijgd camps. **It is important that volunteers speak at least basic English!** If the camp language is not English, a special mention is made in the project description.
- **Work:** Volunteers will work about **30 hours a week** (for example six hours a day, five days a week). Weekends are free. Exceptions are mentioned in the descriptions and are made according to the needs of the project.
- **Accommodation:** Accommodations will usually be in schools, gyms, youth centres, scouts huts or similar. In general, there are **basic conditions but all facilities** like kitchen, toilets and showers are available. If not, it is mentioned in the description.
- **Camp Leaders:** Usually, our camps have **two camp leaders**, trained through ijgd seminars, which will support the organisation of free time activities, keep an account for the money for food and free time activities as well as provide some support to group processes. Due to the principal of self-organization, leaders should not have a leadership role, rather be a participant themselves. They are also responsible for the contact to the project's partners, to take care of administrative details and to ensure self-organization of the group. Apart from these responsibilities, they are **volunteers** like the others.

- **Food:** In most work camps, **meals are prepared in a self-organised manner by participants**. The group cook together (in cooking teams). Money for the food shopping is provided. Vegetarian or vegan meals are possible.
- **Insurance:** All relevant insurance (personal accident, illness, third liability) is provided only within the official camp dates. EU volunteers are not insured against illness, that's why they **have to bring** the European Health Insurance Card EHIC. We strongly recommend to (non-EU) volunteers who plan to travel beyond these dates to bring their own insurance.

### Important Notes:

- Camps are usually for volunteers aged between 16/18 and 26 (no exceptions for older or younger volunteers possible)!
- Volunteers need to reach the age at the beginning of the camp, due to insurance reasons. Should the requested age not be reached at the beginning of the camp, we will have to reject the volunteer (even after confirmation) à Please check before sending the application!
- Volunteers who need a visa have to send their passport number with their application! Please check before sending the application!
- We need an emergency contact from ALL volunteers, but especially minors! Please check before sending the application!
- This year all our camps are multinational (no tri - / bilateral camps)
- We kindly ask ALL volunteers to fill our Medical Fact Sheet

## ijgd 76103 – Against Oblivion II

### Description of work:

Berlin is known for its culture, energy and offering great adventures. In this project, you will also experience some of the quieter sides of the city that only a few people get to see. You are actively engaged in the preservation of the culture of remembrance. Specifically, you are dedicated to the repair and maintenance of graves of victims of war and tyranny (German and non-German soldiers and civilians) at the state-owned cemetery in Berlin-Heiligensee war gravesite. This workcamp is an opportunity to get to know the heritage of the past and learn more about how to promote a culture of peace through memorialisation and remembrance. Your work includes very practical tasks like cleaning the graves and grave marker frames. You and your team will help, among other things, to renew and clear grassy areas, as well as clean grave markers and concrete frames.

### Description of accomodation and food:

You will be accommodated at Gruppenhaus Zeltlagerplatz Heiligensee, Berlin (more infos here: <https://zev-berlin.com/gruppenhaus/>)

You will cook together. Money for food will be provided. Vegetarian or vegan meals are possible. Please state any intolerances during registration.

Please Note: Self-organization is also a key point of the camp during your daily camp routines. Shopping, cooking, and cleaning are all planned and done independently within the group. Each participant is expected to take part in the CCC (cooking-cleaning-crew). The advantage is, of course, that you will have the opportunity to eat international dishes and cuisine at every meal and realize that cleaning yourselves can lead to a great deal of fun in the group.



### Description of location and leisure:

At the accommodation you can make yourselves comfortable and enjoy a great time together slightly outside of the buzz of the big city. Berlin offers many great opportunities. After your work assignment, you can explore Berlin's city center, visit museums or simply relax at a lake. Your accommodation is also a great place to calm down and chill after an active day. In order to be able to pursue the diverse interests of your group, you will be provided with a city ticket for the duration of the camp, which will allow you to use public

transportation throughout the city. If Berlin isn't enough for you, you can also get to other cities like Potsdam and Dresden super quickly or take a day trip to the Baltic.

**Please Note:**

While thinking about your free time together, SELF-ORGANIZATION is the key idea. The group leaders will gladly assist with tips and advice, but will not organize your free time for you.

We expect that all participants will be prepared to actively help plan and decide on elements of the team's group life.

**Remarks (other information):**

Even if the workcamp takes place in Berlin, this is not a vacation and you are not a tourist. As in many other European countries, there are unfortunately also racist, anti-Semitic and discriminatory incidents in Germany. If you experience something like this, please inform the group leader and report it together directly to the Berlin IJGD office.

## ijgd 16039 - Workout with a purpose! Repairing a hiking trail through the mystical moor

### Description of the partner organizing/hosting the project:

#### **Landesforsten Mecklenburg-Vorpommern – Forstamt Schlemmin (State Forestry of Mecklenburg-Western Pomerania – Forestry office Schlemmin)**

The forestry offices of Landesforsten Mecklenburg-Vorpommern perform the tasks of a unified forestry administration: in addition to their forestry work in the state-owned forest and their service offers, this also includes their work as a lower forestry authority - advising and promoting private forest ownership. They also inform all forest visitors about the importance of the forest and the tasks of forestry.

### Description of work:

Forget the gym – we offer a real workout with a purpose! In the middle of one of Mecklenburg's most beautiful nature reserves, on the highest lake in the region, the Black Lake, there is an old wooden path that needs your help. Imagine: a mystical moor, surrounded by ancient beech forests and rare plants and animals. Right there, a hiking trail leads through it, slowly falling into disrepair.

Your mission: 1. Get stuck in, because we'll be hauling, building and repairing the wooden boardwalk together. Every aching muscle is proof that you've achieved something! 2. Teamwork: You're not alone! We'll rock the project together, pave the way ourselves and see exactly what we've created. 3. Adventure: You'll be working in a place that others only visit for hiking. Pure nature, fresh air and a challenge you won't soon forget.

At the end of the day, you will not only have a safe hiking trail with a new handrail, but also YOUR own work. You will have made a unique place accessible to everyone again.

And you will also have learned a lot, because during the practical work, the foresters will tell you a lot about nature conservation and environmental protection in general, as well as the forest and its protection in particular. You will learn a lot about the local flora and fauna, its relevance to the ecosystem and the various measures taken to protect it.

If you're still not convinced, here's some more factual information about your wonderful place of work:

The Black Lake west of Schlemmin (Bernitt municipality) is located near Bützow in Mecklenburg-Western Pomerania. It is part of the Hohe Burg and Black Lake nature reserve. The 110-hectare nature reserve is located in the glacial terminal moraine landscape. The lake is one to two metres deep, covers an area of 2.5 hectares and, at 108 metres above sea level, is the highest lake in Mecklenburg. The lake is completely surrounded by beech forests. The lake's 15-hectare silted-up moor is home to rare and endangered plant species such as round-leaved sundew and snake club moss. The area also provides a habitat for moor frogs, grass snakes, forest lizards, black woodpeckers, treecreepers, red-breasted flycatchers, badgers and numerous other species.



**Description of accommodation and food:**

you will be staying in a self-catering house with 2- and 4-bed rooms in Glambeck (near Bützow), 7 km away from your place of work. The house has a kitchen, two bathrooms with showers and toilets, and two common rooms for eating and group activities. There is a huge green outdoor area with a barbecue and campfire site and access to a lake. You cater for yourselves and cook together. Money for shopping will be provided. Vegetarian or vegan meals are possible. Please indicate any intolerances when registering.

**Description of location and leisure:**

In your free time, you can enjoy the beautiful surroundings and your peaceful accommodation, engage in sporting activities in the huge garden of your accommodation, or spend evenings together by the lake or around the campfire. On the long weekend off (Friday to Sunday), it's worth taking a trip to Rostock, Hamburg or the beautiful sandy beaches of the Baltic Sea.

Fitness for physically strenuous work; It is essential to bring work clothes and (water)resistant footwear and/or work shoes; We would like to invite you to travel as environmentally friendly as possible, e.g. by train, bus or car sharing, and thus make an active contribution to climate protection.

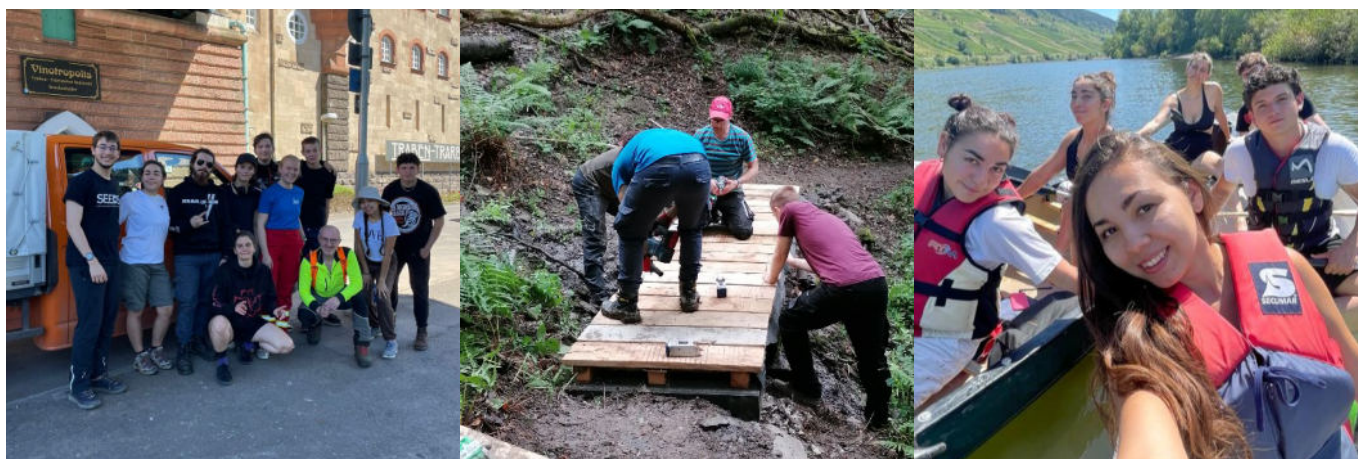

**Description of work:** Your host community Germersheim is looking forward to your help with renovation tasks in the fortress museum. The fortress is present everywhere in Germersheim. The numerous historic buildings are listed and are used in a variety of ways: as a museum, university, music school and youth center. The Ludwigstor, as one of the preserved city gates, will be “your fortress building”, which is used as a museum. In 2025 we had already two successful Workcamps in Germersheim. With your help, the work will continue in 2026.

We are organizing two workcamp with the city of Germersheim this year. In this summer camp, your help is needed to renovate the exhibition rooms. The rooms are to be restored to their original “historical” state as far as possible and everything that deviates from the construction period is to be removed. Specifically: historical windows must be thoroughly refurbished, plywood panels that keep out daylight must be carefully removed, the window timbers must be sanded and revitalized with oily paints. Some of the historic wooden floors have PVC coverings, which should be carefully removed without damaging the substrate, e.g. with a spatula or special tools. Door frames that do not correspond to the construction period, i.e. were added later, must be carefully removed. The aim is to recreate the historical room shape with vaulted ceilings and natural lighting. In order to restore the rooms to their original size, some of the masonry walls even have to be removed. The various demolition materials have to be transported through the building for disposal and sorted, and possibly also stored for reuse. In addition, exhibits such as furniture and pictures must be removed from other rooms and stored properly. To do this, the objects must first be photographed, catalogued and packed.

As you can see, you can really let off steam here, but it's also strenuous work that requires a bit of strength! Turn up the music and off you go. If you want to really let off steam in an old fortress, this is the place for you. Another aspect is that you should document your work digitally, e.g. with a video diary of your work or a photo documentation that not only shows you at work, but also the spatial changes before and after your work assignment.

### **Description of work:**

Landscape and habitat management await you at this camp in northern Germany.

You will be working in the Nordoer Heide nature reserve in south-west Schleswig-Holstein. Much of the area consists of inland dunes, heathland and dry grasslands surrounded by woodland and green spaces. These are grazed by Galloway cattle, Highland cattle, Exmoor ponies and goats to prevent scrub encroachment and keep existing woody vegetation in check. The same purpose is served by the weeding work your group will carry out. This involves removing non-native plants to preserve the unique flora and fauna of the inland dunes and heathland. In various areas, for example, you will make ponds more attractive to amphibians again by cutting back the shrub growth along the water's edge, or improve or restore the habitat of rare plants and animals in the area.

You will also learn a great deal about the conservation of rare habitats, such as inland dunes and heathland, in both theory and practice.

Take the opportunity to play an active role in one of Schleswig-Holstein's most valuable nature conservation areas and make a direct contribution to the preservation of unique species and habitats.

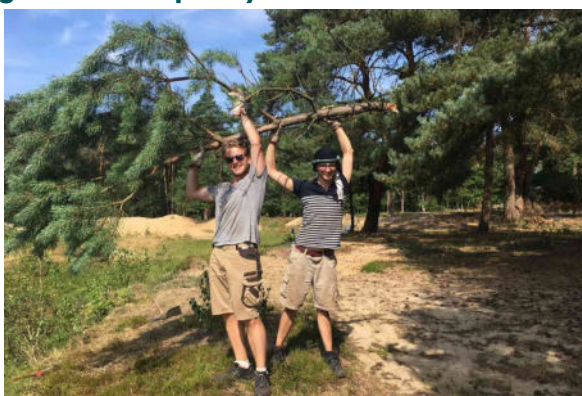

Wetlands are important natural water reservoirs, helping reduce flooding during heavy rainfall, and they also act as valuable climate protectors. On top of that, they're unique habitats for many rare animal and plant species. In the past, however, many wetlands in the Ore Mountains (Erzgebirge) were heavily drained—either to extract peat as fuel or to make the wet areas easier to farm and manage. Once their importance became clear, wetland restoration work began in the region more than 25 years ago. One of these projects is the “Moor am Salzflüsschen”.

Between 2005 and 2009, drainage ditches were filled in and water-retention structures were installed. After almost 20 years, the measures were evaluated and some improvements and repair work were identified. As part of the current project, the first on-site tasks are already being carried out, including: Cutting back shrubs and small trees around the retention structures; Deepening selected ditches so that stored water can seep back into the peat more effectively; Covering the water-retention structures to protect the installed wood and prevent it from rotting.

The forestry offices of Landesforsten Mecklenburg-Vorpommern perform the tasks of a unified forestry administration: in addition to their forestry work in the state-owned forest and their service offers, this also includes their work as a lower forestry authority - advising and promoting private forest ownership. They also inform all forest visitors about the importance of the forest and the tasks of forestry.

**Social Media Project Partner:** -

### Description of work:

The "Alte Nebel" between Lüssow and Bützow was the original course of the "Nebel" river. The lowlands along the river have been used intensively for decades, mainly as grassland and arable land, creating rather poor conditions for the local ecosystem. The task of the State Forestry Agency was to create a development corridor with site-typical trees and shrubs along the "Alte Nebel" in order to accelerate the slow, natural forest development and to greatly reduce the input of plant protection products and fertilisers.

To this end, more than 200,000 trees such as willows, red alders, pedunculate oaks, fluttering elms, downy birches and a wide variety of forest edge shrubs have been planted along around 14 km of the river since 2018.

However, since the beaver has also found a new home along the "Alte Nebel", a large number of trees must now be protected from browsing by the beaver.

From 2023 to 2025, each workcamp group protected over 600 trees using wire trousers.

You are now continuing this work and will also protect 600 to 700 trees on an area of approx. 4 hectares. The wire trousers are made from wildlife fencing, which is cut to a length of 2.2 metres, knotted together and erected. In addition, they are fixed to the ground with two stakes made from recycled plastic, so that the beavers are no longer able to damage the trees.

You will be accompanied by the staff of the local forestry office.

In addition to the practical work, the foresters will teach you a lot about nature and environmental protection in general and about the forest and its protection in particular. You will learn a lot about the local flora and fauna, their relevance for the ecosystem and the various measures for their protection.

### Description of accommodation and food:

You will stay in the "Haus der Begegnung Lüssow" (Meeting house of Luessow), a self-catering house with one room for 5 people, two rooms for 3 and also two rooms for 2 people, on the edge of the small village Lüssow. ### Description of work:

For several years now, volunteer work camps have been helping to clear paths and secure the remains of buildings on the site of the former Zeithain prisoner of war camp. This makes it possible to walk around the site with visitors and explain the history of the camp. Remains of buildings as well as roads and paths have already been recovered. Further work is necessary, for example clearing and cutting free overgrown building sites and paths and renewing wooden shelters to protect the exposed building remains from the weather. In addition, repair and clean-up work is to be carried out at Jacobsthal railway station. The station was the former arrival and departure point for all railway transports, where more than 270,000 prisoners of war arrived between 1941 and 1945. The station was purchased at the end of 2025 and is to be integrated into the memorial site's work in the medium term.

The Ehrenhain Zeithain memorial commemorates the at least 25,000 people who fell victim to malnutrition and catastrophic conditions in the Wehrmacht prisoner-of-war camp from 1941 to 1945.

As part of the German war of extermination against the Soviet Union, a prisoner of war camp was set up in Zeithain in 1941. Initially, only Soviet soldiers from the Red Army were held in the camp. At the time, Ukrainian and Russian soldiers fought together in the Red Army. Up to 30,000 of them died as a result of inhumane living conditions. From February 1943, the camp served as a central hospital for prisoners of war. Prisoners from other nations also arrived during this period. Italian soldiers formed a large group. The majority of them also died due to inadequate nutrition and poor medical care. The dead were buried in five cemeteries in the municipality of Zeithain.

The memorial is located in one of the cemeteries. An exhibition and name plaques commemorate the victims of the camp.

The area of the POW camp was completely cleared after 1945. The huge 66-hectare site is now part of the Gohrlichheide nature reserve and is an unmanaged natural landscape.

The aim of this work camp is to give young people the opportunity to familiarise themselves with archaeological challenges by researching the historical heritage, but also to acquire knowledge about forms of remembrance work.

### Description of accomodation and food:

You cook together. Money for the food shopping is provided to you. Vegetarian or vegan meals are possible. Please indicate any allergies when registering.

### Description of location and leisure:

The camp site and the village of Zeithain are located in a rural setting characterised by the Elbe river and surrounding floodplains. Zeithain is nevertheless very centrally located in the triangle between the major cities of Berlin, Leipzig and Dresden. All cities can be reached by public transport in around one hour. The nearest town is Riesa, 15 kilometres away. There is also a swimming lake in the neighbourhood. In Riesa you can go shopping, eat ice cream or sit in the beer garden by the Elbe. **Description of work:**

The bison enclosure in Springe is one of the most popular destinations in the Hanover region. The main purpose of the wildlife park is to ensure the survival of endangered species, such as bison, through breeding programmes. The Forest Education Centre runs sustainable educational courses for school classes of all ages there. The programme ranges from workshops, animal observation, learning stations, exploration tours, activity days and project weeks to holiday pass activities and children's birthday parties. Your group supports the staff of the Education Centre in various environmental and nature conservation activities on the premises. The main task is to remove fast-growing plants such as ivy and blackberries, which overgrow everything. This creates light and space for more plant diversity. You will help to remove poisonous plants such as belladonna and clear ivy and blackberry vines from part of the historic Saupark wall, which at 16.3 km is the longest architectural monument in Lower Saxony. Climate change is also clearly noticeable in the bison enclosure. To prevent the soil from drying out too much, 'wood islands' made of dead branches are being created under the large trees. You will also be supporting the wildlife park team with this task.

### **Description of work:**

Nature conservation and forest maintenance in beautiful surroundings, plus relaxation on the North Sea beach! You can experience both at this camp in northern Germany. Your work includes very practical tasks like cleaning the graves and grave marker frames. ## ijgd 76140 - Mittelbau-Dora: Making Visible - Remembering and Shaping

**Description of work:** The two-week international encounter project on the site of the former Mittelbau-Dora concentration camp has the motto 'Making visible' and is thus actively involved in the design of the site of today's memorial.

The work during the summer camp will consist of excavation work and the visualisation of a barrack foundation in the infirmary of the former prison camp. The work will take place outdoors, in a wooded area, and large and heavy stones will have to be cut. These stones are turned into flat Outline walls set. The work is part of a larger project: the remains of the foundations on the sites of former barracks are to be gradually made visible again so that visitors to the memorial site can recognise the camp structure, which barely exists any more. This year, work will continue on a foundation that has already been started.

The education and communication part of the project will focus on the history of the Nazi concentration camps and the use of concentration camp prisoners in the underground relocation of the armaments industry - using the Mittelbau-Dora concentration camp as an example. This topic will be approached through tours, working with various sources, exchanging ideas with each other and joint digitally supported project work.

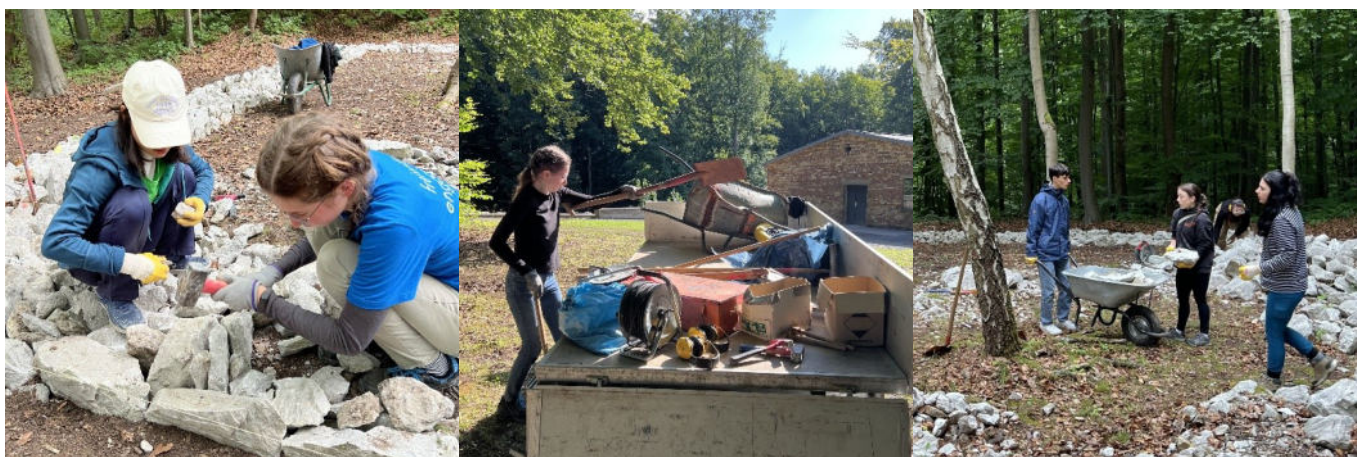
The 'Dora labour camp' was founded at the end of August 1943 as a satellite camp of the Buchenwald concentration camp. As part of the underground relocation of German armaments production in the last two years of the Second World War, concentration camp prisoners had to develop a tunnel system in the Kohnstein mountain near Nordhausen into an underground rocket factory. Series production of the rocket propagated by the Nazi state as 'Retaliation Weapon 2' began in January 1944. During the first few months, the prisoners had to live and work in the tunnels. It was not until spring 1944 that an above-ground barracks camp was built and the Dora satellite camp became the Mittelbau concentration camp in its own right. More than 60,000 people from almost every country in Europe, mainly from the Soviet Union, Poland and France, had to perform forced labour for the German armaments industry in the Mittelbau-Dora concentration camp complex between 1943 and 1945. One in three of them died.

### **Description of accomodation and food:**

WLAN is only available in the memorial centre. Mobile phone reception is average and you will be staying in the Rüstzeithaus of the Protestant parish of Salza in Nordhausen ([Evangelischer Kirchenkreis Südharz | EKM](#)). You will stay overnight and live in a separate house on the parish grounds. There are up to 16 beds in the house. There are three-bed rooms and two-bed rooms available. The house also has washrooms with showers, toilets, a washing machine and a large lounge. The accommodation is approx. 15 minutes by bike from the memorial. WLAN is only available in the memorial centre. Mobile phone reception is average.

### **Description of location and leisure:**

Around 40,000 people live in Nordhausen. The town has a large hospital, a theatre, a cinema, several museums, a university and a tram. Excursions into the surrounding area are possible, as bicycles are provided. Nordhausen is located south of the Harz Mountains. A tourist highlight is the Harz narrow-gauge railway (Harzer Schmalspurbahnen | Home | Home). This is a historic train with a steam locomotive that travels up the highest mountain in the Harz Mountains, the Brocken, every day. Hikes or excursions into the countryside are very easy. There are open-air swimming pools and lakes on the outskirts of the city. Cities such as Leipzig, Göttingen and Weimar are easily accessible by train. Excursions to the Buchenwald Memorial and the Forced Labour Museum in Weimar are planned.

**Remarks (other information):**

- A visit to the Buchenwald Memorial and the Museum of Forced Labor in Weimar, together with our project partner, is firmly planned for the first weekend. You can get further details about this visit from the group leaders.
- You should know how to ride a bicycle, as you will need to travel by bike from the accommodation to Mittelbau-Dora.

**Requirements:** Interest in the history of National Socialism, good English language skills. Safe cycling in road traffic is a prerequisite! A desire for physically demanding work, weatherproof clothing, as the work also takes place outdoors. Mosquito repellent and sun protection are also advisable. Sturdy shoes that can withstand water or are suitable for hiking are a good idea.

The Mittelbau-Dora concentration camp memorial is an international place of remembrance and learning. In summer, the memorial is visited by many tourists from countries such as the Netherlands, France and Denmark. Relatives of former prisoners are also regular guests. The equipment in the seminar rooms is modern and iPads are provided for digital project work during the camp.

The Märkische Schweiz Nature Park, 40 km east of Berlin, offers a unique natural and cultural landscape as well as an area for our project in and around the 'Drei Eichen' environmental education centre. By cooperating with the nature park administration, we will not only get to know the nature park and its surroundings, but also actively help to shape it.

We are offering this work camp because it is fun to have young people from all over the world with us and because we simply need a lot of hands for some of the work!

People and pets live on the grounds of the Drei Eichen environmental education centre - and there are almost always lots of guests: children, families, seminar groups.

We also want to reintroduce wild honeybees that originally lived in cavities in old trees back into our nature park. To do this, we build cavities in sections of tree trunks. You'll help us with that. You'll learn about the different types of bee tree-cavities, and how the bees are observed and cared for. This old art of beekeeping is called Zeidlerei.

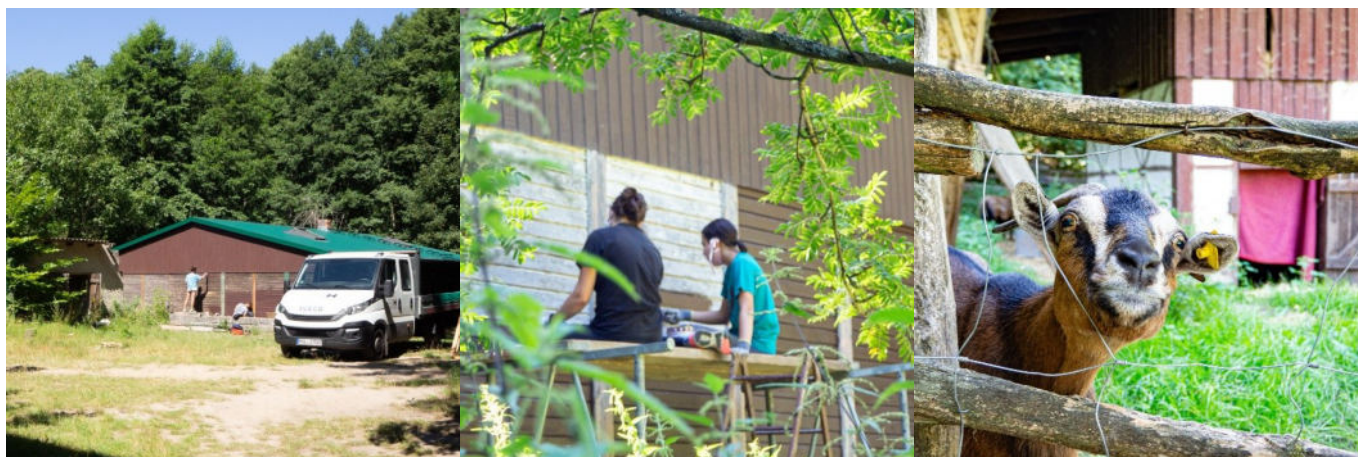
For activities in between, Drei Eichen and its grounds offer many opportunities to learn about plants and animals, nature conservation and alternative ways of life and to actively participate. These include the tipi village and the wilderness education centre, the Zeidlerei station and a pottery workshop. Excursions or courses can be organised here by prior arrangement.

On some days, through your work on the farm you'll be "giving something back to Drei Eichen" — because sometimes we need many helping hands, for example to build a small boardwalk for the pond, remove excessive plant growth from the pond, carry out construction and repair projects, or prepare areas for new planting in late autumn. We'll decide this at short notice, depending on the weather.

At various locations in the Märkische Schweiz Nature Park, we will spend a few days helping to carry out various landscape maintenance tasks in different natural areas. The aim is to protect or promote either particularly dry or particularly wet sites, their soil and the native plants that grow there. Historically, these sites were created and maintained through a lot of manual labour - seasonal mowing and grazing by sheep and goats. Today, we help with this. There are many lakes that invite you to take a refreshing dip after work!

We also want to focus on the topic of water at the camp. The idea is to revitalise a dried-up pond by adding clay, thus keeping the water in the nature park and creating new habitats for amphibians, for example.

All work, whether in landscape conservation, craftsmanship or creative design, takes place outdoors. We plan together on site, depending on the current weather conditions, on which days we do which work and which days we take off.

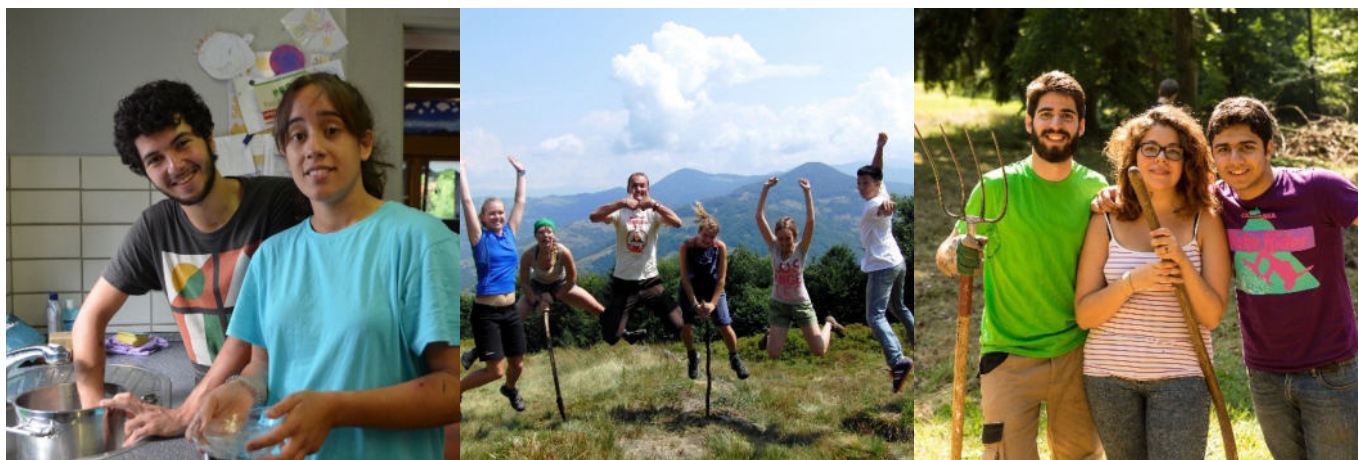

They had to build an underground tunnel system for an armaments factory in neighboring Happurg. The Hersbruck/Happurg documentation site commemorates this camp with two installations: one is located at the former site where the concentration camp prisoners were housed in Hersbruck; the other at the former site of forced labor in Happurg. The Flossenbürg Concentration Camp Memorial offers free public tours every first Sunday of the month at 2 pm. The meeting point is the documentation site in Hersbruck (Badstraße, in the immediate vicinity of the Fackelmann-Therme), where excursions are also available if you would like to take a short historical detour with your group.

### Description of work:

Nature conservation in the city? You might think that there is no room for nature in the city between concrete and tarmac. But if you take a closer look, you are often amazed at what lives there. Where people work, dwell and live, small nature conservation gems are hidden.

Forests located directly in and around cities have a special role to play. Not only do they serve as green lungs for the city, they are also heavily used by visitors who come there to relax. Climate change, storms, beetles and drought are changing the face of the forest. To continue creating good conditions for the future, you will help the team from the Environment Department in Gifhorn to implement environmental protection measures in the district forest. The aim is to avoid damaging the soil with large machines. Working hand in hand, you will remove tree species such as spruce and black cherry, which leave no room for oak trees.

You will then plant young oak trees and build fences to protect the plants from animals (especially deer). To improve the water balance in the forest, a ditch will also be filled in so that valuable water can no longer simply flow out of the forest unused. The rivers that flow through the urban area are also special habitats that are very important for biotope networking. Unfortunately, flooding and careless people mean that rubbish repeatedly ends up in the water, which can also be dangerous for other areas. So, into the boats! One day, you will remove rubbish from the water and embankments along the river. Staff from the Environment Department will supervise and assist you in this work. Your programme will also include an information day about wildlife in near-natural watercourses and a discovery tour into the hidden world of bats.



### Description of accomodation and food:

You will stay at the youth hostel in the city center, which has shared bedrooms, a group room, and a well-equipped kitchen. Right next door, the neighboring youth center “Die Grille” offers leisure activities such as an internet café and table soccer, cozy seating areas, and a beautiful outdoor area for relaxing. ### **Ecological NABU Station Oste-Region (German: Ökologischen NABU-Station Oste-Region)**

The Ecological NABU- Station Oste Region is an institution of NABU Lower Saxony. The station provides local support to the Rotenburg and Stade districts in their management of protected areas. Its core tasks are primarily the recording of animal and plant species, the initiation, planning, implementation and success monitoring of maintenance and development measures, as well as the planning and implementation of species protection measures.

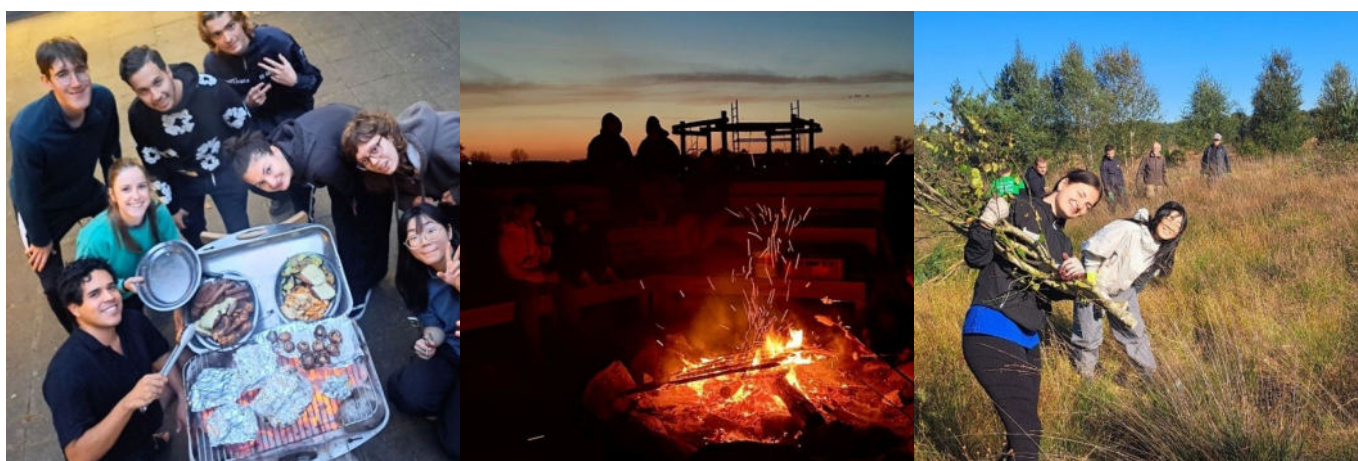
The station not only works closely with the nature conservation authorities, but also with the NABU Bremervörde-Zeven and Stade district groups to coordinate and initiate necessary measures.

### **Description of work:**

You will work with your workcamp group in seven protected areas. In the Fauna-Flora Habitat areas (FFH – habitats of animals and plants protected under EU law) and nature reserves (NSG) "Bullensee and Hemelsmoor", "Hohes Moor", "Großes and Weißes Moor", "Huvenhoopsmoor", you will remove felled trees from former peat cutting areas and heathland to create habitat for endangered and moor-relevant plant species such as sphagnum moss, cranberry and smooth snake. In the Stellingsmoor landscape conservation area (LSG), your group will clear sensitive moorland areas to preserve the moorland development and habitat for the protected smooth snake. In the Bevern Forest nature reserve, you will check bat boxes.

All activities are professionally supervised by the staff and volunteers of the NABU Ecological Station Oste-Region. In addition to the practical work, you will learn a lot about nature conservation and environmental protection in general as well as the natural habitat of moors and heaths and their protection in particular from the staff and volunteers. You will learn a lot about the local flora and fauna, their relevance for the ecosystem and the various measures to protect them.

The cooperation partners for this work camp are the nature conservation authorities of the districts of Rotenburg (Wümme) and Stade, as well as the NABU groups Bremervörde-Zeven and Stade.

### Description of work:

Nature conservation in great surroundings and sightseeing in the big city! - You can experience both at this camp on the outskirts of the metropolis of Hamburg.

You will be working in the Hoeltigbaum nature reserve, a former military training area. A varied mosaic of different habitats has developed on the Hoeltigbaum during and after the last ice age. The result is a variety of old succession stages consisting of open soils, grasslands, fringing meadows and some woodland with many rare and endangered animal and plant species.

Where tanks once travelled, there is now vast savannah-like grassland where flocks of sheep, goats and Galloway cattle graze all year round. Grazing keeps the areas open, prevents scrub encroachment and preserves biodiversity. You support the animal "lawnmowers" in their work and remove plants such as bracken, lupins, ragwort and small birch trees to prepare the ground for the underlying and displaced heathland. This is an important contribution to nature conservation work, as heavy machinery would destroy the sensitive heathland.

The work takes place on the pastures in the nature reserve. However, the grazing animals have plenty of space to hide and are rarely visible. However, if you are lucky, you may catch a glimpse of the cattle and sheep at work.

In addition to the practical work, you will learn a lot about nature and environmental protection in general and the nature conservation concept of a semi-open pasture landscape in particular from the employees of the House of Wild Pastures (Haus der Wilden Weiden). You will learn a lot about the local flora and fauna, year-round grazing and cattle and sheep farming in the area of landscape conservation.

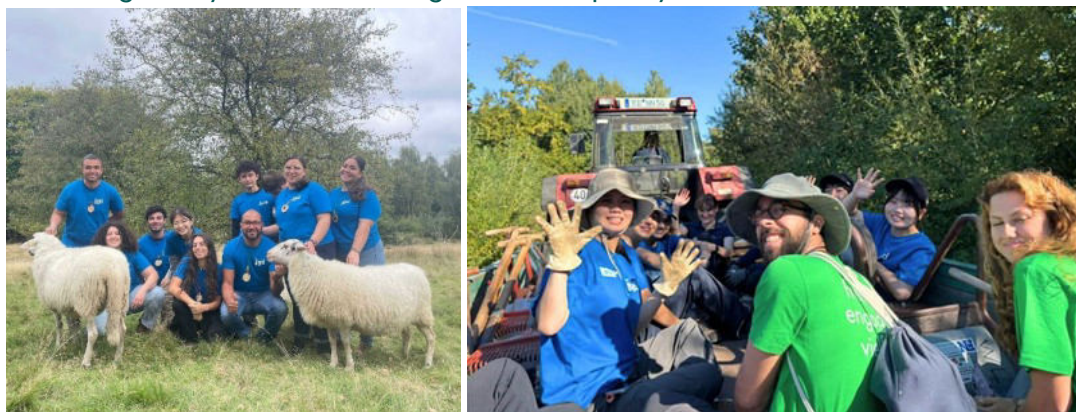

### **Description of work:**

Landscape conservation and nature protection in beautiful surroundings and sightseeing in the big city! You can experience both at this camp on the outskirts of Hamburg.

Under the guidance of staff from the Elbe-Tideauenzentrum, you will mainly work in the Boberger Niederung and Borghorster Elblandschaft nature reserves, as well as in other areas such as the Obere Tideelbe floodplain, Allermöher Wiesen, Horster Moor and Heuckenlock.

The Boberger Niederung nature reserve is exceptionally diverse: sand dunes and heathland, moors, marsh meadows, water bodies and near-natural forests come together on 464 hectares. Around 650 plant species grow here, including many highly endangered or rare species, such as the broad-leaved marsh orchid (a type of orchid). Endangered animal species such as the blue-winged grasshopper, the grass snake and the snipe also have their habitat here. A special feature of the area is the inland dune, which is considered one of the most endangered biotope types in Germany.

Regular maintenance measures are necessary to preserve the open structure and biodiversity of these sensitive habitats. This is where your practical work comes in: you will help mow orchid meadows, remove emerging shrubs such as hawthorn in selected areas ('clearing') and take part in litter collection campaigns.

You will also be active in the Borghorster Elblandschaft nature reserve, where you will be removing scrub and ringing invasive black cherry trees. This involves peeling the bark from the trunk to interrupt the transport of nutrients in the tree, preventing the species from spreading further. In one area, you will also remove Japanese knotweed to curb the spread of this highly invasive neophyte. The approximately 225-hectare area is characterised by a varied floodplain landscape and provides a habitat for numerous animal species, including beavers, orioles and ant lions.

During a trip to the Elbe Tidal Floodplain Centre in Hamburg-Moorwerder, you will get an insight into the exhibition and a guided tour of the adjacent Heuckenlock nature reserve – a unique freshwater floodplain with around 100 hectares of riparian forest in the south of the Elbe island of Wilhelmsburg, where white-tailed eagles breed, among other species. You will probably also help with work in the garden or on the outdoor area of the Elbe Tidal Centre.

In addition to the practical work, you will learn a lot about nature and environmental protection in general as well as the nature and habitat in these special nature reserves from employees of the Elbe Tidal Floodplain Centre. You will learn a lot about the local flora and fauna as well as the special need for protection of animals and plants on the Red List:

## ijgd 16029 - Wild bees, bats and wolves – preserve their habitats!

### **Description of work:**

This workcamp focuses on preserving the habitats of endangered species:

You will be directly helping bats, wild bees and wolves, and at the end of each day you will see what you have achieved for nature with your own hands.

Your work will be as varied as nature itself: a particular highlight is the restoration of an old coal bunker in Friedeholz, which we are converting into a safe winter home for bats. You will become a helper for the smallest creatures when we create flowering beds for wild bees and build new insect hotels. At the same time, you will search for clues like a real researcher: you will map the impressive nests of the large forest ant in Hülsenberg and record giant trees over 200 years old that serve as important cavity trees. You will maintain valuable biotopes such as hedges, ponds, an orchard meadow and the unique Syker Wolfsschlucht gorge. Your area of operation is nature itself – from the forests in Friedeholz to Westermarke and Hachelalpe.

You will also get involved in manual work, building natural seating from wood to guide visitors through nature in an environmentally friendly way.

With every step you take, you actively contribute to preserving biodiversity and help to conserve this unique landscape for future generations.

You will be guided by staff from the local forestry office and volunteer members of NABU Syke und Umland e.V. In addition to the practical work, you will learn the secrets of sustainable forestry on exciting excursions and find out a lot about the local flora and fauna and the protection of nature, the environment and endangered habitats.

Are you in? If you feel like getting involved in nature conservation, making friends for life and having an unforgettable time, then don't hesitate to sign up! Places are limited.

### **Description of accommodation and food:**

You will be staying at the Wöpse seminar house, a self-catering house with 4-bed rooms, on the edge of a landscape conservation area. The house has a kitchen, two bathrooms with showers and toilets, and two common rooms for eating and group activities. There is also a large outdoor area with a lawn where you can play volleyball, football and other games.

You will cook together. Money for food will be provided. Vegetarian or vegan meals are possible. Please state any intolerances during registration.

### **Description of location and leisure:**

Your spacious accommodation with large outdoor grounds offers plenty of space for group activities such as sport or board games. The varied landscape around your accommodation is also ideal for hiking.

At the weekend, you can take trips to the 1,200-year-old Hanseatic city of Bremen, the North Sea coast (e.g. Bremerhaven or Cuxhaven) or Hamburg.

### **Description of work:**

The Märkische Schweiz Nature Park, 40 km east of Berlin, offers a unique natural and cultural landscape as well as an area for our project in and around the 'Drei Eichen' environmental education centre. By cooperating with the nature park administration, we will not only get to know the nature park and its surroundings, but also actively help to shape it.

We are offering this work camp because it is fun to have young people from all over the world with us and because we simply need a lot of hands for some of the work!

People and pets live on the grounds of the Drei Eichen environmental education centre - and there are almost always lots of guests: children, families, seminar groups.

For activities in between, Drei Eichen and its grounds offer many opportunities to learn about plants and animals, nature conservation and alternative ways of life and to actively participate. These include the tipi village and the wilderness education centre, the Zeidlerei station and a pottery workshop. Excursions or courses can be organised here by prior arrangement.

On some days, you'll give something back to "Drei Eichen" by helping out on the farm—because sometimes we need many hands, for example for woodworking, construction projects and repairs, building nest boxes, or planting new vegetation. We decide this at short notice and depending on the weather.

At various locations in the Märkische Schweiz Nature Park, we will spend a few days helping to carry out various landscape conservation work in different natural areas. Autumn is the time when trees and shrubs are pruned, but also when planting takes place and bulbs are put in the ground. We are happy to help here! We also want to tackle invasive species.

There are many lakes and beautiful scenic areas that invite you to explore and relax after work! In autumn, there are also large migrations of cranes and geese, which rest and feed in large numbers on the nearby lakes. It would be possible to organise an excursion with an expert.

All work, whether in landscape conservation, crafts or creative design, takes place outdoors. We plan together on site, depending on the current weather conditions, on which days we do which work and which days we take off.

### **Description of accomodation and food:**

You will stay at the Drei Eichen environmental education centre, located in the middle of the forest, 4km from Buckow ([www.dreichen.de](http://www.dreichen.de)). As a group, you will have a flat with kitchen, bathroom, toilet, lounge-kitchen, large balcony and 3 simple multi-bed rooms. We can also provide tents on request. You cook together. Money for shopping will be provided. Vegetarian or vegan meals are possible. Please indicate any intolerances when registering.

### **Description of location and leisure:**

For activities in between, Drei Eichen with its terrain offers many opportunities to learn about plants and animals, nature conservation and alternative ways of life and to actively participate.

There are many great options for spending your free time. Among them are GPS tour(s) in the nature park, guided hikes on biodiversity, a visit to the bat museum, trips to surrounding lakes, going to the movies, visiting the pub "lokal." in Buckow, making a campfire; going to an artificial climbing forest or doing a canoe tour in the area. Those who long for more urban hustle and bustle on the weekend can also take a day trip to Berlin or even go to Poland, which is not that far away.

We plan together on site, depending on the current weather conditions, among other things, on which days we do what work and on which days we take off.
