Every project is made by many factors, and we need from the volunteers a problem-solving approach.”

The workcamp is coordinated by an experienced volunteer, who is not the boss of the camp: we ask the camp-coordinators to ease the first days of the camp and to involve the volunteers in being responsible for the project, using consensus methodology. The camp-coordinator is not at all responsible for volunteers' fun and the best camp has a camp-coordinator who slightly goes back to the status of normal volunteer.....So, prepare to take responsibilities!

LUNARESC01 Mountain community empowerment 1

Casperia, Latium 21/04/2026-06/05/2026

RENO-MANU-FEST VOLS: 12 AGE: 18-30

Partner

The camp is made in collaboration with the association ALA. Since 2009, ALA association has been working to develop the rural area where it is based, revitalizing the spaces it occupies. Over the years, it has transformed abandoned structures into vibrant community hubs, welcoming both locals and international youth, who have been an integral part of the renovation process. The mountains play a central role in the community, serving for years as a space of active work aimed at making them more accessible through trail cleaning and marking. Through non-formal education and a learning by doing approach, the association offers a place to explore and challenge ourselves, discover our limits, and celebrate our strengths.

Project

Since 2014 ALA has managed the Cognolo Refuge, a mid-mountain hut, brought back to life from a situation of degradation and abandonment, where it carries out hospitality, educational activities, experiences related to nature, and the enhancement of the territory. Running a refuge is an act of care for this rural area, offering an active garrison over the mountain area and facilitating access to the hinterland for all, making known the beauty of these mountains. The day-to-day management of the refuge requires constant maintenance and renovation, which is why the camp focuses on this space by offering volunteers the experience of living in a mountain refuge in its wildness and using this space as a place for experimentation where they can express their creativity and rediscovering the value of manual skills and traditional knowledge.

By joining this workcamp you will contribute to the **Sustainable Development Goals: 11. Sustainable Cities and Communities-** Make cities and human settlements inclusive, safe, resilient, and sustainable; **12. Responsible Consumption and Production-** Ensure sustainable consumption and production pattern; **15. Life on Land- Protect,** restore, and promote sustainable use of terrestrial ecosystems, manage forests sustainably, combat desertification, halt and reverse land degradation, and halt biodiversity loss.

Work

The workcamp will focus on restoring the mountain hut and its surroundings, while also supporting the organization of an annual May 1st music festival. Participants will engage in hands-on tasks, contributing to both the upkeep of the space and the logistics of a public event. The first part of the camp will involve a variety of maintenance activities, from artistic and painting projects to wood collection and manual work, allowing room for creativity and responding to the immediate needs of the site. The second part will focus on festival preparation, with participants helping in logistics, cooking, setting up the space, and organizing workshops. Volunteers will work for 7 hours a day, with two rest days during the project.

Accommodation and Food

Rifugio Cognolo is a charming mountain hut featuring three main areas: a fully equipped kitchen, a multipurpose room, and a covered patio. The hut is off the grid, with electricity provided by solar panels,

and does not have Wi-Fi. Facilities include two bathrooms, one of which is an outdoor dry toilet, and solar-heated showers. The indoor spaces will be primarily used by staff for cooking and as shelter in case of rain, while **volunteers will sleep in tents** in the camping area surrounding the hut. Please note that, considering the season, it is essential to bring appropriate equipment, such as a thermal sleeping bag, to stay comfortable during colder nights. Volunteers will take an active role in managing the space, including cleaning and meal preparation, through organized cooking and cleaning shifts. They will have access to a pantry and will plan and prepare weekly menus, taking into account allergies, dietary preferences, and nutritional needs.

Location and Leisure

Rifugio Cognolo sits at 1000m above sea level in the Sabine Mountains, near the village of Casperia. It is reachable by a moderately challenging 2.5 hour hike, offering volunteers the chance to fully immerse themselves in a setting far removed from everyday life, surrounded by beech forests and breathtaking mountain views. The camp is located in Bassa Sabina, about an hour away from Rome, a rural region defined by the striking contrast between rugged mountain ranges, gentle rolling hills, and the fertile plains of the Tiber River valley with olive groves, vineyards, and small hillside villages dotting the landscape.

Due to the relative isolation of the mountain hut, visits to Rome or other nearby towns will not be possible during the workcamp.

LUNARESC03 Inclusive Summer

Civita Castellana, Latium 10/06/2026-25/06/2026

SOCI-MANU VOLS: 10 AGE: 18-30

Partner

The workcamp is organized by Lunaria in collaboration with Il Pungiglione, a cooperative that supports the development of the local community through welfare services and “production-work” activities. Working alongside the municipality and partner organizations, Il Pungiglione contributes to the planning, implementation, and management of social services and community initiatives, focusing not just on assistance, but on recognizing and nurturing each individual’s abilities.

Project

The project aims to promote the social district through sports and community events and includes integrated social tourism trips to explore the Tuscia area together. A key goal is the inclusion of adults and children with intellectual disabilities or social difficulties, through games and activities that overcome linguistic, cultural and cognitive barriers.

By joining this workcamp you will contribute to the **Sustainable Development Goals: 4. Quality Education**- Ensure inclusive and equitable quality education and promote lifelong learning opportunities for all; **10. Reduced Inequalities**- Reduce inequality within and among countries, **11. Sustainable Cities and Communities**- Make cities and human settlements inclusive, safe, resilient, and sustainable, **16. Peace, Justice, and Strong Institutions**- Promote peaceful and inclusive societies, provide access to justice for all, and build effective, accountable, and inclusive institutions.

The work

Volunteers will take part in the maintenance of the house and neighborhood green areas, planting activities and social agriculture. They will join workshops on different themes and be involved in all the active projects in the area, such as activities in family homes and with children and young people attending the socio-educational center. Volunteers will work about 6 hours per day and will have 3 days off. Schedules may change depending on weather conditions.

Accommodation and Food

Volunteers will be accommodated in a facility owned by the cooperative, with access to two bathrooms and two showers. Each participant will be provided with an inflatable mattress and pillow, but should bring their own sleeping bag. The facility also includes a kitchen where volunteers can cook for themselves. A weekly food budget will be allocated to the group and managed collectively, with guidance from the camp leaders. Whenever possible, local and seasonal products will be available, and vegetarian meals may be prepared from the garden’s produce. A washing machine is also available in the activity area upon reservation.

Location and Leisure

The camp is based in Civita Castellana, a charming town of 15.000 inhabitants in Tuscia, about 65 km north of Rome. The surrounding area is rich in history and natural beauty, with many Etruscan archaeological sites and necropolises, volcanic crater lakes, hot springs, and picturesque towns and villages perched on top of tufa stone cliffs. The town itself has ancient roots dating back to the Etruscans, and its strategic location has made it an important stronghold throughout history. Volunteers during their free time can visit places such as Rome and Viterbo, easily reachable by public transport.

Special Requirements

Please note that this camp is not a holiday experience, but a volunteer project that supports local communities and vulnerable people. LUNAR04 Agape 1

Prali, Piedmont 11/06/2026-24/06/2026

MANU VOLS: 5 AGE: 18+

Partner

The camp is organised by Lunaria in collaboration with the Waldensian Ecumenical Centre Agape.

Agape Centro Ecumenico is a social center that originated after World War II from the ideas of the Waldensian pastor Tullio Vinay in 1947. Its core values of reconciliation and reconstruction continue to shape the center's identity and activities. The center promotes communal living, volunteer work, and international cooperation, supported by a worldwide community of volunteers who actively contribute to its mission.

Project

The center organises national camps that invite guests of all ages to share spaces, time, and reflections while living together in a communal setting. Participants take on different roles within the project: they may cook for guests, plan activities, provide interpretation for international participants, or take part as guests themselves. While camps for minors focus mainly on educational activities, adult camps aim to foster new ways of thinking that enrich the project as a whole. In recent years, the camps have explored themes such as environment and sustainability, intersectionality and equality, and community, connecting these topics with pedagogy, theology, economics, and ecology. During this workcamp there will be two national camps for kids 6-13 yo.

By joining this workcamp you will contribute to the **Sustainable Development Goals: 10. Reduced Inequalities-** Reduce inequality within and among countries; **11. Sustainable Cities and Communities-** Make cities and human settlements inclusive, safe, resilient, and sustainable; **16. Peace, Justice, and Strong Institutions-** Promote peaceful and inclusive societies for sustainable development, provide access to justice for all, and build effective, accountable, and inclusive institutions at all levels.

The work

In Agape there will be more volunteer teams and a group of guests (around 100 people total). The teams, with different tasks, cooperate to provide a service to the guests: a Camp. Your team will help the Resident Group (volunteers living here) in the daily tasks. More teams from other projects will help you. Another team, the Staff, will lead activities for the guest's Camp.

Daily tasks divide in 4 sectors: Kitchen: Cook for the community! Taking care of lunch and dinner. You'll work in a professional kitchen. Team of 8 people, listening to music and.. peeling potatoes;

Cleaning of communal areas: Preparing rooms for new arrivals. Taking care of outdoor areas. More teams of 4 people in different areas; Bar: Serving coffees and more to your friends during the coordinated common breaks; Service: Serve the breakfast for the community, prepare the hall for meals, and dry dishes. Our professional dishwasher does most of the dirty work!

Volunteers will work in 2-3 sectors during the camp, for 5-6 hours a day. There is one free day each 5 working days.

Accommodation and Food

Volunteers will be accommodated within the center in shared rooms hosting 3-4 people. Rooms are generally gender-separated and furnished with single bunk beds. Bathroom facilities are shared and located close to the sleeping areas, ensuring easy access for everyone.

Meals are an important moment of community life at the center. Volunteers and guests eat together in the main dining hall, sharing both food and time. The menu is designed to accommodate different dietary needs and preferences, offering a varied selection that combines traditional Italian cuisine with international recipes. Breakfast follows a typical Italian style and is mostly sweet.

Within the center, volunteers can enjoy snacks and drinks at the bar, free Wi-Fi in the common areas, access to a washing machine, and a shared refrigerator reserved for volunteers.

A small town is located nearby and offers basic shops for everyday needs, although the local pharmacy is not open every day.

Location and Leisure

Located in the heart of the Val Germanasca, in the Italian Alps, the center is a remarkable structure that reflects the character of its natural surroundings. Built from local stone and wood, carefully shaped by generations of volunteers, the building forms a large and welcoming house that harmonizes beautifully with the mountain landscape, preserving the authentic spirit of the valley. The area offers countless opportunities for hiking, with trails suitable for different levels and interests. The nearby town provides a variety of restaurants, cafés, and sports facilities, making it easy to relax or stay active during your free time. For those interested in culture and history, several local museums can be visited, and it is also possible to join a guided tour of the historic talc mines in the surrounding area.

LUNAR05 Carignano Peace and Pride 1
Carignano, Piedmont 14/06/2026-27/06/2026
KIDS-SOCI-CULT VOLS: 8 AGE:18+

Partner

The camp is organized by Lunaria in collaboration with Giovani Insieme. The association is composed of young people for young people founded in October 1998 in Carignano with the aim of protecting, promoting and enhancing artistic, historical and architectural heritage, nature and the environment, by proposing summer work camps for young volunteers from all over Europe.

Project

The workcamps in Carignano were originally launched to restore several rooms in a historic building located in the town's centre, helping to preserve its rich architectural heritage. In recent years, the local organisation "Giovani Insieme Onlus" has expanded its activities to support not only the restoration projects but also the town's summer camp for local children, as well as various cultural exhibitions and community events throughout the year.

Through participating in this project, volunteers have a unique opportunity to immerse themselves in Italian culture and traditions, experiencing daily life in a small Piedmontese town.

By joining this workcamp you will contribute to the **Sustainable Development Goals**:

4. Quality Education- Ensure inclusive and equitable quality education and promote lifelong learning opportunities for all.; **10. Reduced Inequalities**- Reduce inequality within and among countries;**11. Sustainable Cities and Communities**- Make cities and human settlements inclusive, safe, resilient, and sustainable;**16. Peace, Justice, and Strong Institutions**- Promote peaceful and inclusive societies, provide access to justice for all, and build effective, accountable, and inclusive institutions.

The work

Volunteers will work with children aged 6 to 13 (Italian-speaking) at the village summer camp from Monday to Friday. The camp will focus on the theme of peace in different countries, culminating in a presentation for the final show. The local volunteer team will provide translation support for the international volunteers, but flexibility is encouraged. To enrich the experience of cultural exchange, volunteers are invited to discuss topics such as peace and conflict in the history of their countries and to teach the children typical songs or dances from their own traditions.

All these fortresses were partially used and then abandoned during the 20th century. Forte Prenestino is located in one of these fortresses, in a big working-class neighbourhood called Centocelle.

The 1st of may 1986 a mixed group of people, under the pressure of necessity decided to squat Forte Prenestino. Since, there was no cinema, place to make music or to meet each other, they made of this Fortress the perfect spot to exchange and to learn with and from each other. For the last 25 years, full of work, fun and political struggles, the center has become a place of cultural production, autonomously managed and economically independent. Every 1st of may, a huge festival celebrates the creation of Forte Prenestino.

Forte Prenestino organizes concerts and events like Crack!, as well as providing different services for the community such as a restaurant, two pubs, a tea room, a recording studio, a popular gym, and a theater.

Project

Partner

The workcamp is organized by Lunaria in collaboration with Eclettica, an association of young people of the territory that was born in 2022. Last year, Eclettica organized its fifth international workcamp. Thanks to the help of the volunteers it was possible to start the renovation of an abandoned building in Dolcè, the Policaffè, which became the headquarters of the association. The Policaffè was born with the will of being a place where young people could meet up, exchange ideas, dreams, passions and also as a place for intergenerational projects. Right now in the Policaffè are taking place several creative courses (embroidering, cooking, printing, drawing, reading club,...) and lots of other cultural activities involving the community, especially young people.

Project

The project aims to enhance the Dolcè territory by engaging international volunteers and the local community in mountain trail maintenance and restoring the Policaffè accommodation. By fostering social interaction and shared activities, it strengthens the bond between locals and volunteers, creating a collaborative environment for personal growth. Participants will develop key soft skills, such as intercultural communication and teamwork through a hands-on experience of community living and environmental stewardship. It also wants to be a moment for local young people to meet and create a new great community. In addition, a small two-day festival with music, food and various workshops is taking place in Dolcè during the camp. Volunteers will showcase their work during the festival, strengthening the relationships with the local community.

By joining this workcamp you will contribute to the **Sustainable Development Goals: 11. Sustainable Cities and Communities** – Make cities and human settlements inclusive, safe, resilient, and sustainable; **15. Life on Land** – Protect, restore, and promote sustainable use of terrestrial ecosystems, manage forests sustainably, combat desertification, halt and reverse land degradation, and halt biodiversity loss.

The work

The main volunteer tasks will be divided into the following areas:

Trail maintenance and heritage promotion: Volunteers, guided by local experts and community members, will work on cleaning and restoring the hiking trails that start from the village of Dolcè and lead to the area's most iconic spots. Linked to this physical activity, volunteers will develop online and offline communication materials to promote and add value to these trails, conduct interviews with local residents to collect anecdotes, legends, and historical information about the territory, curate and set up an information corner to showcase their findings during the Tacabanda festival.

Renovation of the "Policaffè" Spaces Inside the house, volunteers will have the chance to give the space an international flair through creative signage or other artistic methods of their choice. The practical work will include painting the walls and restoring furniture to improve the common areas.

Accommodation and Food

Volunteers will stay at Policaffè, the same facility where some of the activities will take place. Policaffè is located right next to the railway station, so you will be able to hear the magical sound of passing trains. All volunteers will sleep together in a shared room equipped with beds and cots. The building has several

bathrooms and two showers. The house features a fully equipped kitchen, rooms for relaxation and various activities, and a large garden. The facility also offers Wi-Fi, a washing machine, and a first-aid kit.

Volunteers will be responsible for taking care of the structure that will host them. They are going to clean, and cook their food, but Italian dinners or lunches might be organized so that everybody will enjoy “il vero cibo italiano”. The food is going to provide following the special needs of the volunteers and is going to be mostly vegetarian.

Policaffè is a community hub, and some of its spaces are shared with local community members.

Location and Leisure

Dolcè is a small village located in the heart of the Adige Valley, halfway between the cities of Trento and Verona. The valley, framed by the mountains, is crossed by the Adige River, which gently divides the landscape into two riverbanks. Life in Dolcè is quiet and unhurried, making it an ideal place for those who enjoy peace and close contact with nature. The village is a very peaceful place, surrounded by fields and vineyards. In the village there is only one small bar, which also sells food, tobacco and basic necessities.

During free time, the valley offers walks in the surrounding countryside along the Adige river. On the days off, it is easy to discover the wider region: regular train connections make it convenient to reach nearby cities such as Verona, Trento, or even Venice. Lake Garda is also only about 20km away, although it is less accessible by public transport.

Partner

The camp is organised by Lunaria in collaboration with Immaginaria. Cooperativa Sociale Immaginaria is a non-profit social enterprise whose mission is to create programmes of inclusive arts and creative animation with young people and members of disadvantaged groups living in non-urban areas of southern Italy.

Project

In 2025, Immaginaria purchased a disused property located in the village of Pastene, in the province of Benevento. For over 6 months, local volunteers of all ages have been working to clean and refurbish this building (a typical two-storey rural dwelling with a cellar and large adjoining green area), which has been renamed “Il Borghetto”, with the aim of turning it into a youth centre: the core of the future “Village of Art and Creativity”, imagined by Immaginaria in the historic centre of Pastene. Following this preparatory phase,

with our workcamp we will kick off the creative phase of the project, where international young people will support the local peers in creating a youth centre shaped by themselves, based on their dreams and needs. By joining this workcamp you will contribute to the **Sustainable Development Goals: 4. Quality Education-** Ensure inclusive and equitable quality education and promote lifelong learning opportunities for all; **11. Sustainable Cities and Communities-** Make cities and human settlements inclusive, safe, resilient, and sustainable.

The work

The workcamp aims to make the space of the future youth centre functional and carry out basic refurbishment. The planned work (approx. 6 hours/day, in 2 shifts of 3 hours each), inspired by the principles of green architecture, is aimed at achieving concrete results and constitutes a preparatory phase for the permanent opening of the youth centre.

The programme is divided in two weeks: During the first week volunteers will get to know each other and the local community, starting the set up work of the future youth centre. In the second week, the work focuses on creating an eco-friendly sound installation from the material removed during the set up. Focus sessions of improvisation and ensemble music are integrated to provide creative support for the intervention. The camp concludes with a final evaluation and a public event showcasing the work carried out by the volunteers.

Accommodation and Food

Volunteers will sleep in the local community private flats, together with a responsible person of the host organisation. Each flat can host 3-4 people and is equipped with a bathroom and essential appliances (fridge, washing machine).

Volunteers will eat lunch and dinner together in a camp kitchen. Each meal will be prepared by a professional chef considering personal diets and any food intolerances, while for breakfast they will eat autonomously in their apartments, which will be stocked periodically by our staff based on the requests of each household.

Location and Leisure

The camp takes place in Pastene, a village of about 650 inhabitants on the hills of the Sabato river valley, surrounded by woods and olive groves. The small community is close-knit and welcoming.

Volunteers will have the chance to take walks through the local woods, explore the other villages within the municipality of Sant'Angelo a Cupolo, and go swimming in the nearby river. During free days, trips will also be organized to Benevento and to Naples.

Partner

The camp is organised by Lunaria in collaboration with the IterCulture organization. Its main project Teatri Riflessi Festival, aims at promoting the contemporary performing arts in the peripheral area of Eastern Sicily, specifically on Mount Etna. Its main activities include an International Short Performance Competition that brings to Zafferana Etnea 12 contemporary dance and theatre works from all over the world, artist residency and community-based projects that allows citizens (3,000 spectators, especially non theatregoers) to attend performances and interact with artists from the contemporary performing arts scene.

Project

The workcamp is an initiative developed within the framework of the festival and is built around five main objectives. At its core, it aims to foster international and intergenerational exchange through shared work experiences and community life. It also seeks to encourage social inclusion and active cultural participation by using the performing arts as a powerful tool for expression and connection.

In line with the mission of IterCulture APS, the workcamp contributes to the promotion of inclusion, gender equality, and respect for both the local area and the environment. At the same time, it supports the personal and professional growth of volunteers by strengthening their skills in organisation, communication, and the promotion of live performances. Finally, the initiative works to highlight the Etna area as a vibrant space for cultural production, exchange, and international hospitality.

The project will host 10 international and 4 local volunteers.

By joining this workcamp you will contribute to the **Sustainable Development Goals: 4. Quality Education**- Ensure inclusive and equitable quality education and promote lifelong learning opportunities for all; **5. Gender Equality**- Achieve gender equality and empower all women and girls; **11. Sustainable Cities and Communities**-Make cities and human settlements inclusive, safe, resilient, and sustainable.

The work

During the first few days of the camp, activities are dedicated to getting to know the group, sharing the project's objectives and preparing the festival's set-up. Volunteers participate in introductory workshops, team-building activities and the creation of set-up and communication materials, contributing to the construction of the spaces that will host the events. This phase also includes the preparation and implementation of a collective performance (flash mob), designed as an opportunity to connect with the local area and community. In the middle phase of the camp, the work focuses on completing the set-up in the various festival venues, with volunteers directly involved in the assembly, organisation and adaptation of the spaces. This phase is accompanied by workshops on contemporary performance languages and exchange activities with artists and members of the local community.

During the festival, volunteers assist staff in their daily activities, providing support in welcoming artists and spectators, assisting during shows, forums and art installations, as well as in activities related to internationalisation and public services. The camp ends with dismantling, cleaning of common areas and a final collective evaluation of the experience.

The daily commitment is approximately 8 hours per day, concentrated in the second half of the camp between the afternoon and evening, leaving time for free time, socialising and discovering the local area.

Accommodation and Food

Volunteers will be accommodated in a building in Zafferana Etnea, about 10 minutes on foot from the Municipal Park where the festival activities will take place. The building will be dedicated to the camp volunteers and a few internal staff members.

The building has three floors and is provided with three bathrooms, a dining area, a kitchen, and a very large outdoor space surrounded by greenery. There is a laundry sink available for hand washing. If needed, a laundromat is located nearby. The building is not provided with Wi-Fi and AC.

Volunteers will be lodged in shared bedrooms and will cook for themselves, using a kitchen equipped with utensils suitable for the entire group and a fridge. During the festival days, participants will receive a voucher to eat together with the staff at the festival canteen.

The hosting association will provide groceries for the group in accordance with a no-food-waste policy. The diet will include limited amounts of meat and no junk food, focusing mainly on legumes, vegetables, and fruit.

Location and Leisure

Located on Mount Etna, Zafferana Etnea is a town of around 9.600 inhabitants, but every year hosts plenty of tourists and travellers willing to go for a hike on the volcano or visit the nearby historical cities of Catania and Taormina. Zafferana is located at 600 metres above sea level, so it is usually less warm than in Catania during summer and can get chilly in the evening. During their free time, volunteers will have the opportunity to explore both the local area and some particularly interesting destinations in the surrounding area. Zafferana offers numerous opportunities for morning walks, light nature excursions, visits to woods and lava trails, as well as moments of relaxation in the historic centre and green spaces. During their two days off, volunteers can organise day trips to Mount Etna, as well as visits to cities and places of great cultural and naturalistic value in eastern Sicily, such as Catania, Taormina, Syracuse, Acireale and the Riviera dei Ciclopi, all easily accessible from Zafferana. The camping site is also equipped with 2 compost toilets, made of wood and handmade showers with hot water with tendons for privacy.

The mountains play a central role in the community, serving for years as a space of active work aimed at making them more accessible through trail cleaning and marking. Through non-formal education and a learning by doing approach, the association offers a place to explore and challenge ourselves, discover our limits, and celebrate our strengths.

Project

ALA is collaborating since 2019 with the municipality of Roccantica and its Pro Loco (the local cultural association) in the development of events and festivals for the village. During the camp volunteers will have the chance to support the organisation of the 29th edition of Medioevo in Festa, one of the most evocative and eagerly awaited traditional events in the Sabina region, celebrating one of the most significant historical episode in the town's history: the heroic defense of Roccantica's fortress of 1059.

During the festival, the whole village awakens to the past, with historical costumes, food, music, parades, games, and flickering firelight, as young drummers and trumpeters, flag throwers, dancers, musicians, wild boar hunters, and fire-eaters bring the streets to life.

In addition, the space hosts a library that is open and accessible to everyone.

Project

The project is bringing the world to Carsoli doorsteps every year since 2018, hosting international volunteers and creating concrete opportunities for intercultural exchange.

The workcamp has two main objectives. On the one hand, it involves simple maintenance and improvement activities that allow us to recover and reuse new rooms for the association's activities. On the other hand it aims to expose young people from Carsoli to the wider world.

The workcamp, at its seventh edition, is organized by the Stella Cilento community in cooperation with the Cilento Youth Union Association and the Smak Association, partners already involved in cultural and youth projects aimed at promoting creativity and community participation.

The project aims to support the organization and realization of "Cuntarìa", a village festival dedicated to storytelling, local culture and territorial narration, now in its eighth edition. For five days, the historic center becomes a shared space of encounters, artistic expression and collective celebration, involving the entire local community. Through the involvement of international volunteers, the project promotes intercultural exchange, active participation, creativity and nonformal learning, strengthening the relationship between young people and the local community. By joining this workcamp you will contribute to the **Sustainable Development Goals: 11. Sustainable Cities and Communities**- Make cities and human settlements inclusive, safe, resilient, and sustainable.

The work

Volunteers will be involved in artistic, cultural and organizational activities related to the preparation and implementation of the "Cuntarìa" festival. Under the guidance of local artists and organizers, they will take part in creative workshops aimed at preparing artistic materials and installations for the event.

During the festival, volunteers will support the local team with logistical and organizational tasks such as setting up and dismantling installations, assisting artists and performers, managing stands, supporting food-related activities, cleaning and maintaining public spaces. After the event, they will contribute to the restoration and cleaning of the areas involved. All activities are carried out under supervision and are supportive and educational in nature.

Accommodation and Food

Volunteers will be accommodated in a school building located in the center of the village, reserved exclusively for the group. The structure is equipped with shared rooms, mattresses, bathrooms and a kitchen. Showers are located in a separate building not far away from the accommodation

Meals will be prepared by the volunteers themselves, following a mediterranean diet. They will be supported by a member of the local community, who will introduce them to traditional Cilento cuisine. Whenever possible, fresh products from a local vegetable garden will be used. Meals will be eaten in the common dining area or at the workplace.

Location and Leisure

Stella Cilento is a small rural village located within the National Park of Cilento, Vallo di Diano and Alburni, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, characterized by a rich natural environment, strong traditions and a deep connection with the mediterranean diet and oral storytelling.

During the free days it is possible to reach the beaches along the Cilento coast, such as Ascea and Acciaroli, or explore trails and hiking routes within the Cilento National Park, visit historic villages, and enjoy picnics surrounded by nature.

Cultural visits to sites of historical and archaeological interest, such as Paestum, Pompeii and Naples, may also be organised, in line with the camp programme.

Partner

The camp is made in collaboration with the association ALA. Since 2009, ALA association has been working to develop the rural area where it is based, revitalizing the spaces it occupies. Over the years, it has transformed abandoned structures into vibrant community hubs, welcoming both locals and international youth, who have been an integral part of the renovation process. The mountains play a central role in the

community, serving for years as a space of active work aimed at making them more accessible through trail cleaning and marking. Through non-formal education and a learning by doing approach, the association offers a place to explore and challenge ourselves, discover our limits, and celebrate our strengths.

Project

Since 2014 ALA has managed the Cognolo Refuge, a mid-mountain hut, brought back to life from a situation of degradation and abandonment, where it carries out hospitality, educational activities, experiences related to nature, and the enhancement of the territory. Running a refuge is an act of care for this rural area, offering an active garrison over the mountain area and facilitating access to the hinterland for all, making known the beauty of these mountains. The day-to-day management of the refuge requires constant maintenance and renovation, which is why the camp focuses on this space by offering volunteers the experience of living in a mountain refuge in its wildness and using this space as a place for experimentation where they can express their creativity and rediscovering the value of manual skills and traditional knowledge.

By joining this workcamp you will contribute to the **Sustainable Development Goals: 11. Sustainable Cities and Communities**- Make cities and human settlements inclusive, safe, resilient, and sustainable; **12. Responsible Consumption and Production**- Ensure sustainable consumption and production patterns; **15. Life on Land**- Protect, restore, and promote sustainable use of terrestrial ecosystems, manage forests sustainably, combat desertification, halt and reverse land degradation, and halt biodiversity loss.

The work

The workcamp will focus on restoring the mountain hut and its surroundings, preparing the place for the winter season and future projects. Participants will engage in hands-on tasks, contributing to the upkeep of the space. The camp will involve volunteers in a variety of maintenance activities, from artistic and painting projects to wood collection and manual work, allowing room for creativity and responding to the immediate needs of the site. The daily workload will be approximately 6 hours per day.

Accommodation and Food

Rifugio Cognolo is a charming mountain hut featuring three main areas: a fully equipped kitchen, a multipurpose room, and a covered patio. The hut is off the grid, with electricity provided by solar panels, and does not have Wi-Fi. Facilities include two bathrooms, one of which is an outdoor dry toilet, and solar-heated showers. The indoor spaces will be primarily used by staff for cooking and as shelter in case of rain, while volunteers will sleep in tents in the camping area surrounding the hut. Please note that, considering the altitude of the shelter, it is essential to bring appropriate equipment, such as a thermal sleeping bag, to stay comfortable during colder nights.

Volunteers will take an active role in managing the space, including cleaning and meal preparation, through organized cooking and cleaning shifts. They will have access to a pantry and will plan and prepare weekly menus, taking into account allergies, dietary preferences, and nutritional needs.

Participants can bring typical dry food of their countries to share, but note that there won't be a fridge. Alcohol and drugs are not allowed in the camp.

Location and Leisure

Rifugio Cognolo sits at 1000m above sea level in the Sabine Mountains, near the village of Casperia. It is reachable by a moderately challenging 2.5 hour hike, offering volunteers the chance to fully immerse themselves in a setting far removed from everyday life, surrounded by beech forests and breathtaking

mountain views. The camp is located in Bassa Sabina, about an hour away from Rome, a rural region defined by the striking contrast between rugged mountain ranges, gentle rolling hills, and the fertile plains of the Tiber River valley with olive groves, vineyards, and small hillside villages dotting the landscape. The free time activity will be organized by the leaders to allow participants to explore the surroundings. Due to the relative isolation of the mountain hut, visits to Rome or other nearby towns will not be possible during the workcamp.

Partner

The camp is organised by Lunaria in collaboration with the Waldensian Ecumenical Centre Agape. Agape Centro Ecumenico is a social center that originated after World War II from the ideas of the Waldensian pastor Tullio Vinay in 1947. Its core values of reconciliation and reconstruction continue to shape the center's identity and activities. The center promotes communal living, volunteer work, and international cooperation, supported by a worldwide community of volunteers who actively contribute to its mission.

Project

The center organises national camps that invite guests of all ages to share spaces, time, and reflections while living together in a communal setting. Participants take on different roles within the project: they may cook for guests, plan activities, provide interpretation for international participants, or take part as guests themselves. While camps for minors focus mainly on educational activities, adult camps aim to foster new ways of thinking that enrich the project as a whole. In recent years, the camps have explored themes such as environment and sustainability, intersectionality and equality, and community, connecting these topics with pedagogy, theology, economics, and ecology.

During this workcamp there will be an international camp for adults reflecting on intersectional transfeminism, two camps for kids (10-13 yo) and Agape celebration for the end of the summer.

By joining this workcamp you will contribute to the **Sustainable Development Goals:**

10. Reduced Inequalities- Reduce inequality within and among countries; **11. The work

In Agape there will be more volunteer teams and a group of guests (around 100 people total). The teams,

with different tasks, cooperate to provide a service to the guests: a Camp. Your team will help the Resident Group (volunteers living here) in the daily tasks. More teams from other projects will help you. Another team, the Staff, will lead activities for the guest's Camp.

Daily tasks divide in 4 sectors:

- Kitchen: Cook for the community! Taking care of lunch and dinner. You'll work in a professional kitchen. Team of 8 people, listening to music and.. peeling potatoes;
- Cleaning of communal areas: Preparing rooms for new arrivals. Taking care of outdoor areas. More teams of 4 people on different areas;
- Bar: Serving coffees and more to your friends during the coordinated common breaks;
- Service: Serve the breakfast for the community, prepare the hall for meals, and dry dishes. Our professional dishwasher does most of the dirty work!

Volunteers will work in 2-3 sectors during the camp, for 5-6 hours a day. There is one free day each 5 working days.

Accommodation and Food

Volunteers will be accommodated within the center in shared rooms hosting 3-4 people. Rooms are generally gender-separated and furnished with single bunk beds. Bathroom facilities are shared and located close to the sleeping areas, ensuring easy access for everyone.

Meals are an important moment of community life at the center. Volunteers and guests eat together in the main dining hall, sharing both food and time. The menu is designed to accommodate different dietary needs and preferences, offering a varied selection that combines traditional Italian cuisine with international recipes. Breakfast follows a typical Italian style and is mostly sweet.

Within the center, volunteers can enjoy snacks and drinks at the bar, free Wi-Fi in the common areas, access to a washing machine, and a shared refrigerator reserved for volunteers.

A small town is located nearby and offers basic shops for everyday needs, although the local pharmacy is not open every day.

Location and Leisure

Located in the heart of the Val Germanasca, in the Italian Alps, the center is a remarkable structure that reflects the character of its natural surroundings. Built from local stone and wood, carefully shaped by generations of volunteers, the building forms a large and welcoming house that harmonizes beautifully with the mountain landscape, preserving the authentic spirit of the valley.

The area offers countless opportunities for hiking, with trails suitable for different levels and interests. The nearby town provides a variety of restaurants, cafés, and sports facilities, making it easy to relax or stay active during your free time. For those interested in culture and history, several local museums can be visited, and it is also possible to join a guided tour of the historic talc mines in the surrounding area.

Partner

Casa del Parco Adamello is a multifunctional, community place where people can meet and discuss mountain culture. It is a space committed to territorial promotion where we can draw a path focused on enhancing potential and local resources. Here we arrange cultural events, workshops and training addressed to social innovators and people involved in mountain areas development.

Project

The main purpose of the workcamp is to provide opportunities for meaningful action in a beautiful, fragile, and precious mountain environment, while fostering encounters, exchange, and intercultural dialogue between international volunteers and local communities. As an important outcome, the volunteers' work will result in concrete improvements that allow both residents and visitors to experience the mountains and surrounding territory safely and without risk, making the area a more welcoming, inclusive, and attractive place.

By joining this workcamp you will contribute to the **Sustainable Development Goals: 2. Zero Hunger**- End hunger, achieve food security and improved nutrition, and promote sustainable agriculture; **11. Sustainable Cities and Communities**- Make cities and human settlements inclusive, safe, resilient, and sustainable; **12. Responsible Consumption and Production**- Ensure sustainable consumption and production patterns; **15. Life on Land**- Protect, restore, and promote sustainable use of terrestrial ecosystems, manage forests sustainably, combat desertification, halt and reverse land degradation, and halt biodiversity loss.

The work

Volunteers will be mainly involved in cleaning and maintaining the high and medium mountain and agro-silvo-pastoral paths adjacent to the hostel, as well as supporting the activities of agricultural companies. They will also be involved in restoring the signs of the local paths and in taking care of the greenery of the large park surrounding the hostel. For the identification of the routes, obtaining permits, on-site accompaniment and assistance during the carrying out of activities relating to the paths, we avail ourselves of the support and collaboration of the Cedegolo section of the Italian Alpine Club (CAI), of the Valcamonica Mountain Community, of the municipal administrations of Cevo and Saviore dell'Adamello and some agricultural companies in Valsaviore. The shifts will be 6 hours per day, for 5 days a week. We guarantee 1 rest days depending on the weather conditions.

Accommodation and Food

Participants will be hosted at the Casa del Parco hostel and accommodated in several shared rooms: each room has 4 to 5 beds, private bathroom and shower. There are several common areas, including reading rooms, a restaurant and a large outdoor garden, as well as free Wi-Fi and the possibility of using the washing machine once a week.

Due to the location of the facility in a closed valley, we cannot guarantee a fast internet connection. Meals will be served mainly in the hostel with a predominantly vegetarian menu, however variations may be made to meet different needs. When necessary, volunteers are expected to bring a packed lunch, while on other days they will have lunch together with the local community or at the farms that will host them for their tasks. Volunteers can feel free to help the staff with meal preparation, set and clear the tables.

Location and Leisure

Cevo is a small mountain village of 800 inhabitants located inside the Adamello Regional Park, at an altitude of 1100 m. Placed at the junction of two valleys closed by the head of Adamello glacier, it offers a barely anthropic, natural environment which counts on a reduced tourism flow. An atmosphere foreign to urban chaos where time seems to flow slowly, ideal to hike surrounded by nature.

Partner

The camp is organised by Lunaria in collaboration with the Piero Simoni Foundation - Valle Sabbia Archaeological Museum. The Valle Sabbia Archaeological Museum is responsible for researching, promoting and disseminating information about the archaeology of the Valle Sabbia area and the western Lake Garda area. The project was created to support this institution in its activities and then move into the local area to collaborate on promotional initiatives. The Museum manages the excavation at Lucone di Polpenazze, a prehistoric pile dwelling that is part of the UNESCO site "Prehistoric Piledwellings around the Alps".

Project

In recent years, the Museum has launched a project to study and publish data from the archaeological excavation of the UNESCO heritage site of Lucone di Polpenazze and other excavations in the area. Various scholars, including archaeozoologists and palaeobotanists, are studying the materials found in the excavation. The workcamp, in collaboration with the Valle Sabbia Museum System and the Municipality of Gavardo, will consist of helping museum staff wash and organise the palaeontological and archaeozoological material found in the museum's excavations, as well as assisting experts in reconstructing the environment and economy of the past. In the final days of the camp, there will be an opportunity to collaborate with local schools on projects related to archaeology and the environment.

By joining this workcamp you will contribute to the **Sustainable Development Goals:**

4. Quality Education- Ensure inclusive and equitable quality education and promote lifelong learning opportunities for all; **11. Sustainable Cities and Communities-** Make cities and human settlements inclusive, safe, resilient, and sustainable; **15. The work

The work involves studying materials found in the museum's excavations, with a particular focus on archaeozoological materials, such as the remains of domestic and wild animal bones found in archaeological layers. The materials must be washed and labelled before being studied by experts. The main work will consist of washing the animal remains and ceramic fragments found in the excavations with water and a brush, labelling them with a pen and cataloguing them. Volunteers will work for 7 hours a day. Training sessions will be provided by archaeologists and archaeozoologists. During the workcamp there will also be a big celebration: the museum is turning 70, and volunteers will be involved in organising the festivities.

Accommodation and Food

Volunteers will be lodged in an apartment with two shared dorms, two bathrooms with showers and a common kitchen. The kitchen has all the necessary supplies for daily cooking and the local host will provide grocery shopping with all the basic items weekly. All the extras are in charge of the volunteers.

During the working days, lunches are provided at a local restaurant, while dinners are always on the volunteers.

Location and Leisure

Gavardo is a town of 12.000 inhabitants in the province of Brescia, located in Valle Sabbia a few kilometres from Lake Garda. One of the most important towns in the valley, it combines history, culture and nature: it is home to the Valle Sabbia Archaeological Museum, which preserves artefacts from prehistoric times to the Roman era, and has a characteristic historic centre with churches and picturesque views along the Chiese River. Surrounded by hills and nature trails, Gavardo is also an ideal starting point for excursions, walks and outdoor activities between the valley and the lake.

During the camp, there will be several organised trips to explore the surrounding area.

In their free time, volunteers can reach Lake Garda and the towns of Salò, Gardone and Toscolano in just 15 minutes by bus. In just 40 minutes, you can also reach the city of Brescia, which is rich in museums and leisure activities.
