**Radio on (t') Air** *European Youth Exchange*

Join us on an adventure in the heart of the Vosges mountains with the Radio on (t')Air project! For two weeks, we will meet to discuss, share, record, and explore the theme of working the land together, using radio as our medium.

The aim of this project is to bring us together around a common subject: our relationship with the soil/land. It also aims to introduce people to radio in a context where podcasts are multiplying and enjoying growing success. Radio will be a way for us to meet the local population and ask questions about the subject: what is our connection to the land today? Has it evolved over time, particularly in terms of how we grow our own vegetables? Has a love of gardening been passed down to us? And any other questions that may arise from our encounters and discussions.

With the guiding principles of discovering, exchanging, creating, and sharing, you will:

- ✦ Meet and share moments with local residents through radio workshops (interviews, vox pops...)
- ✦ Spend time in nature and gardens with farmers, local people, and environmental protection organizations.
- ✦ Take part in group activities and workshops (fun, spontaneous or organised, and convivial);
- ✦ Exchange and reflect on our relationship with the land, its environmental and social challenges; explore more sustainable ways of living, while giving participants a voice through radio workshops to question how we grow, consume, and inhabit our local area, with a focus on individual and collective well-being;
- ✦ To conclude the project, create and host a radio program. Depending on the creative path we take together, the program will be shaped by recordings made throughout the project.
